Leo J. Shea III, Ph.D. to Participate in the International Network Seminar on Rehabilitation

New York, NY – October 4, 2007 – Leo J. Shea III, Ph.D., Clinical Assistant Professor of Rehabilitation Medicine at Rusk Institute, a division of the New York University Medical Center, has been invited to present at the International Network Seminar on Rehabilitation in Jerusalem and Bethlehem from October 18th through 21st, 2007. His presentation, titled OPD Neuropsychological Rehabilitation: Individual and Group Psychotherapy and Family Intervention, will focus on Traumatic Brain Injury.

Dr. Shea is President of Neuropsychological Evaluation & Treatment Services, P.C. Prior to his present work with tick-borne and immunological disorders, he was Assistant Director of the NYU Brain Injury Day Treatment Program. Dr. Shea has served as an organizational consultant to national and international corporations on human resources, administrative and executive training and development, trauma response and health care issues. His clients have included both political and public institutions such as the United Nations.

He maintains a private practice both in New York City and Quincy, Massachusetts focusing on traumatic brain injury, tick-borne diseases, neurological injury/illness, chronic illness, trauma and loss, as well as psychotherapy and cognitive remediation with individuals and groups in corporate, entertainment and religious settings.

Dr. Shea holds Master's Degrees in Counseling Psychology from the Harvard Graduate School of Education, an M.A. in Hispanic Pastoral Ministry from Barry University and an M.S. in Clinical Psychology and a Ph.D. with a dual specialty in Clinical Psychology and Neuropsychology from the Miami Institute of Psychology. Apart from his academic degrees, he is a graduate of the Organizational Development and Consultation Program at the William Alanson White Institute for Psychoanalysis, Psychiatry and Psychology and is a member of both the Institute's Organizational Work Group and its Trauma Response Training Committee. His trauma work during the 9/11 disaster has been cited in "When the Worst is Over."
